

The purpose will be to receive and act on a report from the Commission on a Way Forward based on the recommendations of the Council of Bishops.

Is the United Methodist Church as a denomination splitting up?

It is very difficult to predict. There are some groups that are lobbying for a split because they do not believe that the United Methodist Church can agree to disagree on issues of human sexuality. The plan recommended by the Council of Bishops gives pastors, churches and Annual Conferences permission to minister as they see fit in their local context. This means that a pastor could preside over a same gender marriage without fear of being brought up on charges. It also means that a pastor would not be forced to preside over a same gender marriage if it did not fit with their theology.

What does this mean for The Well?

It is difficult to know the exact implications for The Well at this time.

Legislation at General Conference is often amended and changed on the floor of the Conference. Until a final report is voted on and accepted at the General Conference it will be difficult to know its impact.

The Governance Team of The Well has spent the last two years working with the congregation to clarify our core values. The Well has four core values:

- Living Like Jesus
- Caring for Kids
- Inclusive of All
- Intentionally Non-Partisan

It is these core values that guide, and will continue to guide ministry of The Well as we move forward. Our plan is to continue to live our our mission to “Connect people to Jesus Christ for the Transformation of Our Community.”

What can you do?

- 1) You are encouraged to read and study the report of the Commission on a Way Forward using the links listed on page 12.
- 2) Pastor Karen Bruins recommends these books found on the Bishops’ resource list:
 - “The Anatomy of Peace: Resolving the Heart of Conflict” by The Arbinger Institute: This is one of the books studied by the Commission on a Way Forward. It seeks to inspire reconciliation through the premise that people whose hearts are at peace do not wage war, whether they’re heads of state or members of a family.
 - “Unafraid and Unashamed: Facing the Future of United Methodism” by Wil Cantrell: This book cultivates faith, respect for disparate opinions, appreciation for the Wesleyan means of grace, and commitment to the church. It was designed as a tool for effectively communicating the issues facing the denomination in a manner that strengthens the church
- 3) Pray for the work of the General Conference.



If you are not able to participate in that event, please consider making a monetary contribution to Feed My Starving Children. Through FMSC, it costs \$80 to feed a kid for a year. No donation is too small, as every dollar counts. Please note "January One Thing" on your check made out to The Well. It can be put in the offering or mailed to the church office.

Founded in 1987, Feed My Starving Children (FMSC) is a Christian non-profit that provides nutritionally complete meals specifically formulated for malnourished children. Their goal is to feed everyone who needs to be fed. One of the ways they are trying to accomplish that is by having groups of volunteers prepare, pack and pray over meal packs. More than 70 countries have received specially designed Mannapacks, a fortified meal pack that just requires water to prepare. In 2017, more than 333 million meals were packed by over 1.2 million volunteers.
